MS106-10 Answers

Read 1 John 1:1-4

- 1) John said the life appeared; they had seen it and testified to it, and they proclaimed to us the eternal life, which was with the Father and had appeared to them. (1:1-2)
- 2) John saw Jesus who came from the Father and is eternal life. This is what he was testifying to. (1:2)
- 3) John was proclaiming what he had seen and heard so that they also might have fellowship with them. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. (1:3)
- 4) John's stated reason for writing this letter was to make our joy complete. (1:4)

Read 1 John 1:5-10

- 5) The message that John had heard and was now proclaiming was that God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. (1:5)
- 6) John said that if we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. (1:6)
- 7) We are to walk in the light, as he is in the light, then we will have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. (1:7)
- 8) John said those who claim to be without sin, deceive themselves and the truth is not in them. If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us. (1:8,10)
- 9) If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. (1:9)

Read 1 John 2:1-6

- 10) John wrote his letter so that we would not sin. (2:1)
- 11) If anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father--Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world. (2:1-2)
- 12) We know that we have come to know God if we keep his commands. Whoever says, "I know him," but does not do what he commands is a liar, and the truth is not in that person. But if anyone obeys his word, love for God is truly made complete in them. (2:3-5)
- 13) If you claim to live in Christ we must live as Jesus did. (2:6)
